

Intersections Journal Submission Guidelines

We strongly recommend setting up a meeting with our team prior to making an official submission. Please fill out the form on our page to set up a meeting. The earlier you meet with us, the better! This gives you more time to ensure your paper is ready to be considered for publication, therefore increasing your likelihood of acceptance into the publication process.

How to Submit

- 1) Once you have met with our team (strongly recommended), you may submit your paper for publication consideration by emailing editor [Line Kruse](#) and CC assistant editor [Ainsley Aiono](#). **Submissions for our 2025 issue are open from Feb 1, 2024, to October 31, 2024 at 5:00pm HST.**
 - i) Files must be a Microsoft Word document.
 - ii) Submissions should be a polished final draft. Unfinished, working drafts will be rejected.
 - iii) Papers must go through the Reading Writing Lab at least once before submission to Intersections Journal.
 - iv) Please ensure to check the journal requirements before submitting.
- 2) Within approximately one business week, you will receive an acknowledgment notice either accepting or rejecting your submission.
 - i) If accepted, you will receive the next steps needed to prepare your paper for peer review.

Intersections Journal Requirements

- Minimum eight pages (not including title page or works cited). There is no maximum page limit.
- Chicago-style, author-date format.
- Scholarship based in either the Asian or Pacific regions (or both).
- Interdisciplinary.
- Papers may be co-authored or group-authored.
- You may submit more than one paper with no maximum limit.
